

In *Better Living Through Birding*, Cooper tells the story of his life leading up to the incident in Central Park and shows how a life spent looking up at the birds prepared him to be a gay, Black man in America. From sharpened senses that work just as well at a protest as in a park, to what the Common Grackle can teach us about self-acceptance, *Better Living Through Birding* exults in the pleasures of a life lived in pursuit of the natural world and invites you to discover them yourself.
