Trustee Training Policy

Background and Purpose

Beginning January 1, 2023, all members of library boards of trustees will complete a minimum of two hours of trustee education annually in compliance with New York State Education Law 260-d as added by Chapter 468 of the Laws of 2021. This policy demonstrates the Babylon Public Library Board's commitment to the continuing education of all members of the Babylon Public Library community and affirms that Library trustees will actively pursue development opportunities that help them increase competence and confidence in their role governing the library system.

Procedure

Each Library trustee will complete at least two hours of trustee education each calendar year. Per Education Law 260-d, each trustee shall demonstrate compliance with the requirements by filing with the President of the Board evidence of completion of the trustee education from an approved provider. Compliance shall be demonstrated by submission of one of the following:

- 1. a certificate of completion issued by an approved provider, or
- 2. a designated self-assurance form (see Appendix)

Evidence of completion shall be submitted to the Board by December 1 of each year [this date is flexible and is not codified in the law].

The Clerk of the Board will, on behalf of the Board President, keep the record of trustee continuing education activities.

Approved Providers

Trustee education providers and activities, including topics and formats, are approved by the New York State Library acting on behalf of the Commissioner of Education.

Additionally, the State Library authorizes public library systems to approve additional trustee education providers and activities.

New York State Library's approved providers are:

- New York State Library/Division of Library Development
- Public Library Systems/Public Library System Directors Organization
- Web Junction
- New York Library Association (including all sections and roundtables)
- New York Reference and Research Library Resources Councils (including LILRC)
- Empire State Library Network (formerly New York 3Rs Association)
- American Library Association (including United for Libraries and other divisions)

Trustee education may be delivered online or in person. Acceptable presentation formats include lectures, workshops, webinars, online courses, and local, state or national library association conferences. Eligible trustee education topics may include financial oversight, accountability, fiduciary responsibility and the general powers and duties of a library trustee.

Reimbursement for Continuing Education

Modest and reasonable costs incurred in completion of trustee education requirements may be reimbursed by the Library in accordance with the Conference and Travel Policy [revise to comport with name of your policy that addresses reimbursement]. Any continuing education activities must be pre-authorized by the Board President prior to the event.

Compliance

Compliance will be tracked through the Library Annual Report to the State.

Should a trustee fail to submit evidence of completion by December 1 of each year, they will be suspended from duty until such evidence is filed with the Board President and/or the Clerk of the Board as described previously. Should a trustee in suspension fail to provide evidence of completion within 90 days, they will be assumed to have resigned from the board. Absent reasonable explanation, as determined by the Board, the Board shall consider a trustee's failure to file evidence of completion as evidence of misconduct, incapacity, or neglect of duty.

SELF-ASSURANCE of Trustee Education Activity Completion

Beginning January 1, 2023, each library trustee, elected or appointed, of a board of trustees is required to complete a minimum of two hours of trustee education annually, as per New York State Education Law 260-d as added by Chapter 468 of the Laws of 2021. On November 28, 2022, the Babylon Public Library] Board approved Trustee Training Policy that requires current and future Library trustees do the same.
